



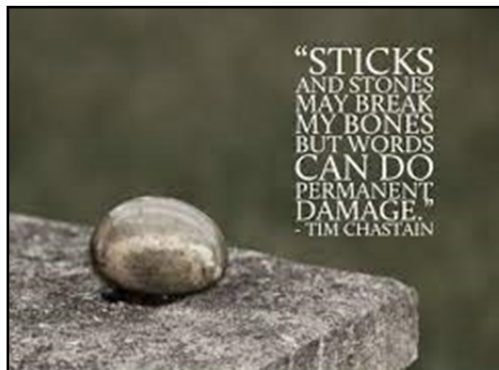

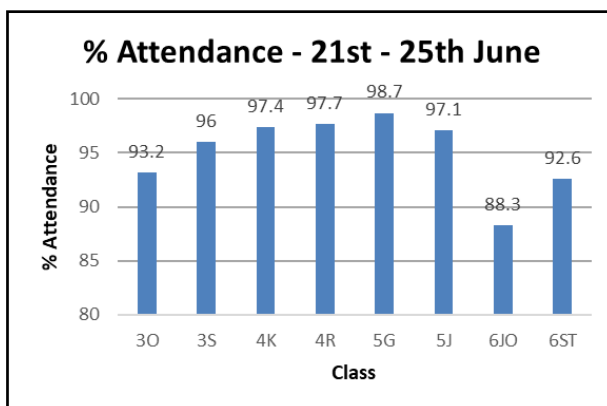
The BIG Question

Hillingdon Food Bank

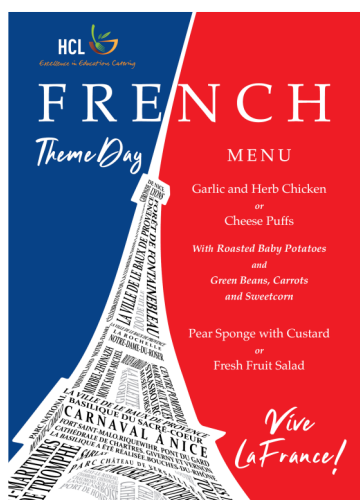
