

## HILLSIDE JUNIOR SCHOOL - PE and SPORTS PREMIUM 2017/18

From September 2013 each Primary School was allocated funding by the government directly to support the provision of quality PE/Sport. This funding is used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and Sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE, June 2013)

Hillside Junior School was allocated £14,506 for the financial period from April 2017 until March 2018.

Total money spent in 2017-2018 is £16,747 with an overspend of £2,241.

We do not spend any of the funding on swimming lessons. Year 5 pupils attend swimming lessons during the year and 74% of Year 6 pupils meet the Swimming National Curriculum requirement.

### Use of Funding:

- A specialist gymnastics teacher is working alongside our teachers to improve delivery of lessons
- We are continuing to deliver a range of extra-curricular sporting opportunities, these are mostly funded by the school, only when we need to use an outside provider are pupils charged to attend a club
- Targeted groups of reluctant children take part in a specific weekly programme which has improved their confidence in PE
- Gifted and talented pupils are receiving extra training
- We have employed a designated Sports Coach, who is a qualified teacher with Sport/PE as his specialism to provide a wide range of sporting activities
- Increased networking with other schools on PE and Games

## Impact of Funding:

- Increased participation and success in Borough Tournaments
- Boys' football - We won the Borough Finals' football competition and won the Knock Out Cup for North Hillingdon in Spring 2018
- Rounders - We won the Borough Tournament in Summer 2017; the team is coached by our HLTA who is a qualified Netball Coach
- Our pupils are noticeably more active during lunchtimes, buddies have been trained to lead active playtime games
- The delivery of gymnastic lessons has improved and this is evident by the pupils' involvement and skills in gymnastics.
- Profile has been raised in PE throughout the school and specific achievements are awarded to pupils who make the most effort or progress
- Staff have developed their pedagogy in the teaching of gymnastics
- Increased pupil confidence, self-esteem and independence for targeted pupils
- Increased attendance for after school clubs and participation in PE and sports - delivered by our own Sports Coach teacher and teaching assistants
- Girls' Football - We competed in the Borough Competition
- We participated in Tag Rugby tournament and Cricket tournaments at St Johns School.
- Netball - We came 5<sup>th</sup> in the Ruislip Northwood District Competition. Our Boys' Netball team compete in the District Competition. We are mostly winning our weekly inter-school matches.
