


Hillside Junior School Weekly Bulletin

Message from Mr. Davies

In our assemblies this week, we have carried on the theme of anti-bullying. We looked at the example of Quinn, a five year old girl who uses a wheelchair. Unfortunately, when she was younger an adult verbally abused her whilst she was on the way to school in her wheelchair. This had a huge impact on her self-esteem. Consequently, some well-known personalities made a video to support her. Aspiration was key and Hannah Cockroft, gold medallist Paralympian, spoke about the challenges she had personally overcome. The response from the children was very reflective and insightful. Goals and aspirations are something we very much promote and through our 6Rs we aim to support the children on this "journey". In the words of Michael Jordan, hard work is key.



Timings of the School Day

A number of children are arriving late to school everyday. Timings of the school day are below and we expect your child to be in class at those times. Your child will receive a late mark if they are not in class at 8.40am or 8.50am respectively. Please note the school gates are opened 5 minutes before the start of school for both the upper and lower school.

Upper School (Years 5 & 6) 8.40am—3.10pm Lower School: (Years 3 & 4) 8.50 am—3.20pm

If your child arrives after 9.15am they may receive a mark that shows them to be on site, but will not count as a present mark and it will mean they have an unauthorised absence. This may mean that you could face the possibility of a Penalty Notice if the problem persists. The table below shows how lateness can add up over a school year.

Local residents have again expressed concerns about illegal and unsafe parking outside school. <u>PLEASE DO NOT</u> block driveways, double park or stop on the zebra crossing to allow children to jump out. Northwood Way by the width restriction is a major concern at the moment.
